<u>Humane Society of Scott County</u> and <u>Quad City Animal Welfare Center</u> are hosting a free vaccination clinic on Sunday, October 5. See all the details below!

Vaccinating your dog for rabies, distemper, and parvovirus is crucial for several reasons:

- Preventing Disease: These
 diseases can be severe or fatal.
 Rabies is zoonotic, meaning it can
 be transmitted to humans, while
 distemper and parvo can cause
 serious illness in dogs.
- Community Health: Vaccination helps protect not just your pet but also the wider community. By reducing the prevalence of these diseases, we protect other animals and even people.



- <u>Legal Requirements</u>: Rabies vaccination is often legally required in many areas. Failing to vaccinate can result in fines and other penalties.
- <u>Cost-Effective</u>: Treating these diseases can be extremely costly. Vaccination is a small investment compared to the potential medical bills from treating a preventable illness.
- <u>Peace of Mind</u>: Knowing your dog is vaccinated allows you to enjoy outings and socializing with other pets without constant worry about disease transmission.
